TIMELINE &

The program has been guided by the Adolescent Health Advisory Board (AHAB), a multi-sector network of healthcare providers, social service professionals and community members that was brought together by the Healthy Start Coalition (HSC) in 2017, following the transition of funds for adolescent health programming from NextGen Alliance, Inc.

The timeline below outlines key milestones since the initiation of the Adolescent Health Advisory Board under the direction of the HSC.

2017 - 2018:

- AHAB quarterly meetings to review teen pregnancy, birth, and STI rates to identify priority areas for improving teen access to sexual health services and removing barriers to care
- Application of a secret shopper model to identify gaps in existing services
- Development of program framework and key focus areas

2019:

- July: Implementation of adolescent health navigation and referral services at the USF Health Ybor Youth Clinic (YYC)
- August: Teen Connect website launched
- October-December: Recruitment of high school students to form the Teen Youth Advisory Board (YAB)











INDIVIDUALS SERVED


As of October 31, 2021, a total of 828 resource referrals were provided to patients (ages 13-24) at the Ybor Youth Clinic since integration of the Adolescent Health Navigator in July 2019.



442 patients at the Ybor Youth Clinic received personalized navigation services based on their individual needs.




The number of patients who have received personalized navigation services has continued to grow each year, with the number of patients served in 2021 already exceeding the previous year by 42.





As of October 31, 2021, the Teen Connect website has engaged 10,143 users and received 22,848 pageviews since launching in August 2019.

Users have increased by 316% compared to the previous year (8,137 vs. 1,956).







EMAIL MARKETING

Through our partnership with the USF Health Ybor Youth Clinic, we launched a joint email newsletter in September 2020 that has a current reach of 359 people. Youth who receive navigation services have the opportunity to opt-in to the email list, as well as community partners via the Teen Connect and YYC websites and social media pages.





The Teen Connect Instagram (@teenconnecttampa) has engaged 426 followers, with a 67% growth rate in the past year. Since launching the Instagram channel in February 2020, Teen Connect Instagram posts have achieved a combined reach of 15,117 (the number of accounts that saw a post).







Profile Growth & Discovery – Followers November 2020 – November 2021




25 students across 11 high schools in Hillsborough County have been engaged as members or volunteers of the Teen Connect Youth Advisory Board (YAB) since January 2020.


Teen Connect has facilitated 35 YAB meetings and events that have included skill-building and educational workshops, youth volunteer events, and activities focused on developing and launching a youth-led sexual health marketing campaign.

The first cohort implemented their youth-led marketing campaign in September 2020, which leveraged multiple digital marketing and communications channels to reach teens with information about the importance of STI testing and breaking down the associated stigma.

- In the month of September, the campaign reached 2,376 people (2,062 via Instagram and 314 via the Teen Connect website).
- In addition, several paid Instagram advertisements were used for targeted outreach to high school students. The combined reach of paid Instagram ads in September was 8,244 people.
- The Teen's Guide to Getting Tested video received 110 views through Instagram and YouTube.
- A subsequent video project, COVID-19 Vaccine Teen Testimonials, received 556 views through Instagram and YouTube.


TRAININGS

TRAINING EVALUATIONS


Surveys show that the majority of parent participants reported a significant amount of knowledge gained post-training in areas including tips for talking to their child/teen about sexual health, ways to help young people feel comfortable asking for support, and adolescent health resources in Hillsborough County.



The Ybor Youth Clinic received the 2021 Excellence in Adolescent Health Award from the Adolescent Health Initiative. This award is given to programs that demonstrate core values of Collaboration, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion,

Expertise, Innovation, Quality, and Responsiveness.

The Ybor Youth Clinic successfully completed the Adolescent-Centered Environment Assessment Process and received certification as a silver adolescent-centered health center.

- This included an 18-month quality improvement process and self-assessment of the clinic's environment, policies and practices related to youthfriendly services.
- YYC is the first clinic in Florida to receive this designation by the national Adolescent Health Initiative.
